Ave Maria University Academics Presenting at Rare International Thomistic Congress in Rome

AMU well-represented in Rome during historical theological conference

ROME, Sept. 22, 2022 – Faculty from Ave Maria University in Florida will be presenters at the 11th International Thomistic Congress, which is taking place in Rome September 19-26, 2022. The Congress is a rare event, with only ten of them having taken place since 1925. It is focused on pressing issues of faith and reason in the current culture and hosted and organized by the Pontifical Academy of St. Thomas Aquinas. The last one took place in 2003.

“We are more than honored to have the opportunity to attend and present at this rare, international Congress at the Angelicum in Rome,” said Roger Nutt, S.T.L., S.T.D. Provost, professor of theology at Ave Maria University in Florida. “AMU will be well-represented at the Congress and we are looking forward to sharing our insights into the theology of the great St. Thomas Aquinas.”

The presenters at the Congress from Ave Maria University are Daniel Lendman, Kara Logan, Steven Long, Nutt and Adam Van Wart. Additionally, one alumna from the AMU doctoral program, Sr. Albert Marie Surmanski, is also presenting. To present at the Congress, you either have to be invited by the Academy or submit a proposal and have it approved by a review board.

AMU has the most presenters of any institution in North America. In addition to participation at this high level in the conference, the participants will also privately meet with Pope Francis at the Vatican on Thursday, September 22.
